The Office of Diversity and Inclusion, under the direction of the Diversity Outreach Programs, partnered with Tulsa area Tribal Nations, AEP/PSO, and TCC's NASA student organization to host the TCC/Tribal Nations College Achievement Summit.

This event was held on Thursday, December 7, at Northeast Campus. There were approximately 211 students in attendance. With 188 students submitting surveys, the response rate is 89 percent. Submitted responses are reflected in the tables and comments below.
