Tulsa Community College 2011-2012 Alumni Survey Report July 17, 2013 Office of Planning and Institutional Research

Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to present results from the 2011-2012 Tulsa Community College Alumni Survey. The Alumni Survey is an instrument that is administered annually to assess the current situation and perceptions of students who have completed either a certificate or a degree program at Tulsa Community College.

The Alumni Survey is a tool that can be used by individual offices (e.g., Associate Deans, Deans, Provosts) to help gauge educational objectives and track the success of educational outcomes of graduates of Tulsa Community College. This survey provides students a method to convey current demographic information as well as feedback on a variety of dimensions that are related to successful implementation of program outcomes. These dimensions are indirectly related to the educational experiences at TCC (e.g., employment status, current educational objectives, and preparedness to continue education). This report provides a summary of all survey responses.

- 2,502 degrees and certificates were awarded to 2,456 graduates during the 2011-2012 academic year (Fall 2011, Spring 2012 and Summer 2012).
- ❖ Alumni surveys were mailed to all 2,456 graduates. Of the delivered surveys, 274 were returned completed, yielding an 11% response rate.
- ❖ The credentials awarded to graduates included both university transfer and workforce development. Of respondents (some respondents earned multiple credentials resulting in a total percentage that is greater than 100%):
 - o 59% indicated receiving a university transfer degree (AA or AS).
 - o 37% indicated receiving a workforce development degree or certificate (AAS or certificate).
 - o 11% indicated receiving both a transfer degree and certificate.
- ❖ Alumni were asked about their current educational objectives:
 - o 64% of the respondents are continuing their education.
 - o 27% plan to continue, but are not yet enrolled.
- Respondents were also asked about their current employment status:
 - o 66% of respondents indicated that they are employed. (Of those who indicated employment, 66% work full-time; 34% work part-time)
 - o 92% of those employed are employed in Tulsa or Northeast Oklahoma.
 - o Among respondents who are employed, 46% reported that they are either working in their major field or in an area that is closely related to their field of study at TCC.
 - Of the respondents who provided an estimate of their annual salary, 36% indicated annual incomes of \$30,000 or more per year.
- Detailed results and response frequencies for each survey item are presented in this report.

Participants and Procedure

During the academic year 2011-2012, Tulsa Community College conferred degrees and certificates for 2,456 individuals. During the 2012-2013 academic year, the Office of Planning and Institutional Research mailed the annual survey to all students who completed a certificate or degree program in the prior academic year. The survey provides a method for graduates to evaluate their educational experiences in the context of life (e.g., work, continuing education, personal life) after earning an award from TCC. Table 1 contains selected characteristics of these graduates based upon the Banner Student system.

Results

Although 274 completed surveys were returned, some respondents did not complete all survey items; Table 2 reports the number (N) and percentage (%) of item responses for each item of the survey. Blank items and invalid responses are not reported.

Of the 181 respondents who reported their employment status as full-time or part-time, 66% indicated full-time and 34% reported part-time employment. Considering only respondents who indicated employment, 46% reported working in either their major field or a closely related field. Of 258 respondents, 64% indicated that they were continuing their education, while 27% indicated they plan to continue their education but had not yet enrolled at the time of the survey.

The survey also measured the general satisfaction that alumni had with their educational experiences while at TCC. One measure of a student's general satisfaction with his/her education is the extent to which he/she would attend the same school again if given the opportunity. Of those who responded to this item, 98% indicated that they would be at least somewhat likely to attend TCC again, with 76% indicating that they would very likely make the same choice.

When asked to compare the quality of education at TCC, of those who responded, 45% indicated that the quality of education at TCC is about the same, and 25% indicated that they thought the quality of education at TCC was better. Finally, 29% reported that they were prepared exceptionally well by TCC to continue their education, and an additional 56% indicated that they were adequately to more than adequately prepared.
